Teenage booster vaccinations

Your child is due to have two booster vaccinations. One protects against diphtheria, tetanus and polio. The other against meningitis and septicaemia.

The School Aged Immunisation Service (SAIS) offers these vaccines in school when children are in year 9, or in year 10 if missed in year 9 and we have a consent form from you.

The vaccines do not contain gelatine.

Information about the teenage booster vaccinations

Vaccine 1 (Td/IPV) offers protection against three things:

Diphtheria is a serious disease that usually begins with a sore throat. It can cause breathing problems and damage the heart and nervous system. In severe cases, it can kill.

Tetanus is a painful disease affecting the nervous system. It can lead to muscle spasms, may cause breathing problems and can kill. Tetanus is caused by germs found in the soil and manure that get into your body through open cuts or burns.

Polio is a virus that attacks the nervous system. It can cause permanent paralysis of muscles. If it affects the chest muscles or the brain, polio can also kill.

Vaccine 2 (Men ACWY) offers protection against most meningitis and septicaemia.

Meningitis affects the lining of the brain. It can be caused by viruses, bacteria, or other disease-causing organisms. Meningitis can also occur after an injury.

Septicaemia is blood poisoning. It is very serious, especially if not diagnosed early, and can lead to death.
