<b>Description of the topic and key learning outcomes (key knowledge and understanding)</b>	<p>Learning aim A: Explore ideas, plan and pitch for a micro-enterprise activity</p> <p>Learners will generate their own ideas suitable for a micro-enterprise activity. This activity should be capable of completion in a minimum of one week for an online enterprise or a minimum of two trading sessions for a physical enterprise, to give learners sufficient time to generate evidence to meet the assessment criteria.</p> <p>Level 1 learners will develop an outline plan but may need some support and guidance to ensure that all components of the plan are in place before they start to run the micro-enterprise activity. The evidence will include the outline plan, not all elements may be present and the financial forecasts may not be accurate. The pitch of the outline plan will be brief.</p> <p>Level 2 learners will develop a comprehensive plan for their micro-enterprise, this will need to be based on the research concepts from Component 1. However, this is not the only element of the plan; all other aspects must be in place before they start to run the enterprise. Financial forecasts will be realistic for the type of enterprise activity and timescales.</p> <p>Outcome Students will complete this component of the coursework and have gathered a good solid understanding of competitor behaviour. Students will have completed this section of the coursework</p>	<p>Learning aim B: Operate and review the success of a micro-enterprise activity</p> <p>Learners will develop their knowledge and understanding of the entrepreneurial skills required to set up and run a micro-enterprise activity. Learners will develop critical thinking skills as they review and reflect the performance of the enterprise and how successful they were as an entrepreneur.</p> <p>At level 1, learners may need greater guidance and will not take responsibility for all actions, describing their contribution and making some simple statements about the success, or otherwise, of the activity.</p> <p>At level 2, learners will use appropriate skills proactively and fluently, taking responsibility for their actions, reflecting on their own performance and making a reasoned judgement as to how they could improve their performance in the future.</p> <p>Outcome Students will complete this component of the coursework and have gathered a good solid understanding of competitor behaviour. Students will have completed this section of the coursework</p>
