Compulsory Branded Items

Blazer	Grey blazer with school logo	This must be worn at all times unless staff give permission for it to be removed.
Tie	John Willmott School clip on tie	This must be worn at all times

Compulsory Non-Branded Items


Jumper	V-neck knitted grey jumper	This must be a knitted jumper. No sweatshirts or hoodies are allowed.
Trousers or skirt	Black tailored or straight school trousers. Skirts should be tailored (pleated or pencil skirts) of a reasonable length (i.e.: just above the knee).	Jeans, tracksuit bottoms and leggings are not allowed. Lycra, jersey, knitted or tight fitted skirts are not appropriate for school.
Shirts	Plain white long or short sleeved shirts.	This should have a stiff collar, be buttoned to the neck and tucked in at all times.
Socks / Opaque tights	Black socks or black opaque tights.	
Plain, black shoes	Plain black shoes of sturdy leather (or leather style).	Trainers, platform, backless or open toe shoes, coloured laces or visible branding, ballet pumps, fabric shoes or leather trainers are not considered appropriate styles for school (see image below).
Outdoor coats	Coats should be worn and waterproof.	No hooded tops or any other non-school wear can be worn under or instead of blazers. Outdoor coats are not to be worn in the school building.

Jewellery and Hair

- Students may wear a maximum of one pair of small, plain metal (silver/gold) stud earrings in the lobe of the ears and a wrist watch. These should be removed for PE, dance and enrichment activities
- No other jewellery or visible body piercing, including tongue studs, is permitted
- Make-up, fake tan, nail varnish or acrylic nails may not be worn.

I'm sure you will agree it's been a really successful term and I know I speak for all staff when I say I can't wait to see what the rest of the year holds for our amazing students! Have a happy and safe Christmas and I look forward to seeing you all in the new year. A reminder term starts on Wednesday 4 January at 8:45am.
