Uniform

Some students are wearing tight fitted **trousers** that are not in alignment with our dress code standards. Please be reminded that school trousers should not be tight fitting. The guidance is in place to ensure that students maintain a respectful and modest appearance, contributing to the overall professional atmosphere of our school. Only tailored or slim trousers are allowed to be worn. Please see the pictures for further guidance:

Earrings and jewellery, including bracelets: Please note that students should only wear one earring in the lobe of the ears and a wristwatch. **No other jewellery** is allowed to be worn in school. This is for health and safety reasons.

Clear nose studs: If your child has a pierced nose, we require them to wear a clear nose stud. Students arriving to school without a clear nose stud will be asked to remove the stud.

Nails: must be of a natural colour and acrylic nails should not be worn.

Equipment: Students require following equipment for their lessons:

Black ink pen x2 / Green ink pen x2 / Pencil / Eraser / Ruler / Scientific calculator / Protractor / Glue Stick

Students without the correct equipment will be issued with a 'standards' detention at breaktime. All equipment, except the for the scientific calculator and glue stick will be checked daily. Please note, we will expect students to have all equipment items from September 2024.

New School Uniform from September 2024

We are pleased to inform you that the ATLP will be funding all of the compulsory branded items for our new school uniform for current students in Years 7, 8, 9 & 10. Communication about the roll out will be towards the end of the Summer term.

Please note, from September 2024, students will be required to wear navy blue trousers or navy-blue tailored skirt, not more than 5cm above the knee. If you need to replace any of your child's uniform before September, please purchase the navy-blue skirts, trousers or PE shorts as described above.
